Main duties:

Prepare and develop judo players for Area squad selection and identify potential talent for both Area and National level.

In conjunction with the BJA Technical Officer, liaise and contribute to the production of Long Term Development Plans (LTDP).

Liaise with Coaches within the Western Area as necessary.

Maintain records as required.

Qualifications:

Minimum requirement: Club Coach or UKCC approved coach award (Min Level 2).

Must also hold a current BJA Licence (minimum grade: BJA 1st Dan).

Responsible to:

Western Area Chairman/Executive Committee acting under advice from the BJA Technical Officer.

Skills Required:

- Good all-round knowledge and understanding of Judo.
- Proven background in coaching Judo.
- Confident with good leadership skills.
- Enthusiastic and a good motivator.
- Ability to communicate both verbally and in writing with groups and individuals.
